Chairman's Update

At the recent Community Council Meeting an interim election was held and 6 Community Councillors were appointed bringing the total to 13 which is the maximum number we are allowed.

The New School Complex is complete and will be in use by the time you get this month's Newsletter. It is looking fantastic and having viewed the Community Rooms it will be a tremendous facility for the village for years to come.

We would confirm that the next Community Council Meeting is being held in the New School Complex on the 04/09/17 at 7pm and we would like to give a sincere thanks to the Committee of St Thomas's Hall and in particular to Wilma Brady for accommodating us during the construction works.

The latest update regarding the Asset Transfer of the Day Centre is the Tender returns for the alteration works were due back on the 19th August 2017 following which a Contract will be placed with the winning bidder. The works are likely to start in September and will take 8-12 weeks and it is envisaged that the Community Hub will open no later than January 2018.

In the meantime, the Games Hall is remaining open on a restricted hours basis and on the 1st September the existing Library will be run by volunteers talking of which we could always do with some more help. If you have some spare time and want to assist you will be made most welcome.

At the latest Community Council Meeting it was reported that dog fouling is again on the increase and we would take this opportunity to remind all dog owners of their responsibility to clean up after their animals as there are strict laws covering this and we would encourage the public to be vigilant and report offenders to the appropriate authorities.

It is our intention to hold a Public Meeting to allow the residents hear first-hand about the monies that are becoming available from the Gala whistle Wind farm and as to what Projects it can be used on. The Meeting will be chaired by the Community Council and a presentation will be given by East Ayrshire Council who are responsible for the administration of the Renewable Fund.

This is the first edition that we have produced that is only being delivered to the residents who completed the forms requesting a hard copy. There will be a number of copies placed in the shops together with forms so if you forgot or changed your mind and want a hard copy it is not a problem to add you to our list. The online version will be made available when we have completed the proof reading which will be approx. 1 week in advance of the hard copies.

The Gaiety Rural Touring Group are coming to Muirkirk on the 3rd November 2017 and putting on a Murder Mystery Show in St Thomas's Hall. The tickets will be sold when they become available by the Gaiety and by the Nearly New Shop in Muirkirk.

Finally, we are very happy with your continuing support both with the News and the Community Council and would welcome your feedback.

Festival Report:

Saturday 10th June saw the final event of the 2017 Lapraik Poetry Festival. The Young People's Speaking Competition saw the culmination of an extended range of events in recognition of the celebration of a decade of Festivals since its inception in 2008.

The Young People of Muirkirk Primary School showed a great deal of talent in their delivery of a variety of poems learned 'off by heart' and presented with confidence and the right level of dramatic interpretation. As has become tradition, the Muirkirk readers were joined by representatives from other local schools who competed in an 'open' section. This year the schools represented were Mauchline, Catrine, Greenmill and Barshare.

Earlier in the week the primary school students had enjoyed Scots Language workshops organised by 'Ayrshire's Bard', Rab Wilson. The workshops covered many topics from Scots words and phrases to story-telling in Scots.

At the other end of the Festival period, a full-house enjoyed international-standard entertainment at Crambo-Jingle and Sang in the Coach House Inn. A special surprise for the audience was the presence of the historic 'Gregg Violin' (owned by Robert Burns' teacher) which was played by local musician Alistair McCulloch ably supported by Sean Gray from Coylton. In addition to these talented musicians, Clair Hastings (former Young Traditional Musician of the Year) from Dumfries enthralled the audience with her beautiful voice and ukulele playing. Scots Language poetry added to the wide repertoire enjoyed by all who attended and this was provided by Andrew McNeil, Chris Rollie and Rab Wilson.

The World John Lapraik Speaking Competition on the first Saturday of the Festival, hosted by angus Middleton, was also very-well attended and saw George Park of New Cumnock gain the 2017 title after strong competition from runners-up John Hutcheson and Willie Dick and the other competitors, Eric Dempster and Hugh McHarg. Andy Brown entertained the audience with an excellent rendition of 'Tam o'Shanter' while the judges deliberated their decision. While George Park went forward to the Lapraik Masters competition in the afternoon, John Hutcheson very ably delivered the John Lapraik Memorial Reading at the Parish Kirkyard while Gordon Wilson played an appropriate lament on the pipes.

The Lapraik Master's competition in the afternoon was a new event to celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the Lapraik festival. After stiff competition from all the previous winners from 10 years of the John Lapraik Speaking Competition, Susan Chown of Alloa was victorious and was presented with the Ayrshire Association of Burns Clubs Trophy by Burns Federation World President, Bobby Kane. Runners-up were Wull Horne from Girvan (and Cockenzie) and Neil Macgillivray of Glasgow. Entertainment during the judges' deliberations was provided by Hugh McHarg with his own unique delivery of Robert Burns' 'Death And Dying Words Of Poor Mailie' and Jimmy Law's excellent rendition of Robin Cairns' 'Lochgelly'!

The final event of the first weekend was a partner event, (with the Robert Burns Birthplace Museum in Alloway) 'Brither Bards', where Rab Wilson and Professor Alan Riach described the relationship between Robert Burns and John Lapraik, and their contemporaries, to a very appreciative audience.

Update from SMRT on Restoration Operations

Together with East Ayrshire Council and stakeholders, the Scottish Mines Restoration Trust (SMRT) has been continuing to progress revised restoration plans at Ponesk / Spireslack and Powharnal. The Trust is delighted to once again update the community via this newsletter and welcomes further input on future plans.

Mines Restoration Ltd. (MRL), the operational arm of the Scottish Mines Restoration Trust (SMRT), is pleased to confirm that permission for the revised Powharnal Restoration Scheme has been granted by East Ayrshire Council following an extensive consultation period. Located to the west of Muirkirk, SMRT has been heavily engaged on the Powharnal site.

As readers may be aware, the scheme takes into account a revised landform together with public access and ecological issues, the latter in support of a government initiative to ensure that obligations in respect of the Muirkirk & North Lowther Special Protection Area (SPA) are met.

Works are now progressing as planned – both on site and on adjacent moorlands – and the community can expect to see the revised landform emerge over the next two to three years. With that in mind, East Ayrshire Council will shortly convene a Community Liaison Committee Meeting under the terms of the planning permission and further detail of the works program will be presented.

Similarly, work under contract to Banks Mining at Ponesk has been progressing well and the revised landform is now substantially complete, with soiling and drainage operations ongoing. We are advised that work – including muck shifting on the eastern side of Ponesk Burn, and soil and compost mix being spread – is around 70 per cent complete and is on schedule for overall completion within the contract program.

Discussions have also taken place with Banks Mining with a view to undertaking key engineering works and landscaping on Spireslack to the east of Glenbuck. None of the works will affect the heritage of Glenbuck, with that being addressed by SMRT under a separate scheme which is being developed with SMRT and potential Heritage Lottery input.

SMRT has also reached agreement regarding the felling of Grasshill Forest and that is due to commence later this year. As part of that process, woodland re-stocking will take place over a wider and more diverse footprint, seeking to establish mixed commercial and amenity plantings. Details of that scheme will be formalised shortly and discussed at a Community Liaison Meeting to be called by East Ayrshire Council.

Professor Russel Griggs, Chair of both SMRT and MRL, said: “I am encouraged by the progress that is being made and look forward to further liaison with the local community as these schemes at Ponesk, Spireslack, Powharnal and Dalfad undergo further development and implementation.

“Our objective continues to be to engage meaningfully with the stakeholders involved in the restoration process and to work closely in collaboration with them to find solutions to the sites’ varying challenges and opportunities.

“Success is dependent on the strength of those relationships as we seek a pragmatic and innovative approach to restoration – and we are seeing significant goodwill from all community groups, landowners, private sector and Government as we progress towards that aim.”
