Chairman's Update

We have held our 1st Meeting in one of the New School Complex Community Rooms and we can confirm how impressed we were with the design and overall quality of the finished product.

We have reverted back to the 1st Monday of the month for the Meeting's and whilst it was well attended by members of the public we will review the situation at the end of the year and take soundings regards people's preference.

The MEG Group took over the running of the Community Library on Monday the 4th September which will be open for 4 days a week, Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays & Fridays. It is manned by volunteers and if anyone is interested in giving a few hours of their valuable time you can make this known at the Library.

The Contractor has been appointed for the alteration & upgrading works at the Day Centre with the works due to start on the 25th September 2017 with completion due on the 1st December 2017.

This probably means that it will be open as a Community Hub for public use in January 2018

We take this opportunity to thank Billy Tait, Morag Dempster and Brenda Muir on their recent retirements after a long number of years of public service and we wish them all health and happiness for many years to come.

The Community Council, Community Association, MEG, the Catholic and Church of Scotland are all involved in the planning of the 60 years Commemoration of the Kames Disaster which will be held at 2pm on the 19th November 2017 which will be sixty years to the day.

The Council recently held a Conversation Cafe in the New School Complex to gauge public opinion regarding the problem of void properties in the village and as to what is the best solution. There is no simple answer to this as the village continues to suffer from population drift and a number of streets are proving difficult to get houses let. The Council will take cognisance of the findings and will come back with their proposals at some future juncture.

Last month's edition of the Muirkirk News was printed by a Commercial Printing Company and the feedback has been very positive regarding the quality of the end product which we would intend to continue certainly for the foreseeable future.

In addition to the friendly atmosphere between drivers from both sides of the border, there will be extra interest for spectators as this meeting has a habit of attracting surprise late entries from leading competitors. It was at this meeting three years ago, for example that Stirling driver Wallace Menzies was timed at an amazing 129 mph in his big V8 engined racing car. Wallace, who holds the outright record for Kames is currently lying second in the prestigious British Hillclimb Championship.

Many drivers will be taking this opportunity for a final outing before retiring to their workshops to work on plans for the 2018 season.

Practice starts around 10 am with the final runs expected around 3 pm to allow those competitors heading for the M74 and M6 to make an early exit.

MATTERS ARISING: Doctors still awaiting BT. Lines were down today. Still a gap in barrier at school entrance and cable ties fixed to barrier, Sally Whittet is dealing with this. Seat outside cemetery been painted, one at Henderson Drive not been touched as yet. (CL). Gaiety Theatre murder mystery on 3rd November in St Thomas's hall. Tickets will be on sale at charity shop.EAC has no issues with Trotters building although broken down-pipe has been causing problems during rain showers. (CL)Classic car show was successful.

POLICE REPORT: None in attendance.

COUNCILLORS: Council in recess. School looking great. There will be an official opening soon.

MEG: Stone dyke has been repaired. No reimbursment of $\pounds 96$ this will be appealed.

TREASURERS REPORT: Balance - £2609.69. Zumba has received all PB monies held in account.

CORRESPONDENCE: Letter from CND with details of route used for nuclear waste. Suggested to invite to a meeting in future. It was agreed that even if Muirkirk Community Council voted against the route/movement it would make no difference.

PLANNING: Keystore application to change store room to hot food take away.

MUIRKIRK NEWS: There were still problems with the printing of last issue. The management at NHS has changed. It was decided to source a commercial printer. The estimate given is for 250 copies. These will be full gloss, colour, stapled and delivered to Muirkirk for £196. This month will be a trial run and if suitable will contract company to continue to supply magazines.

The response from the slips has been quite good. Extra copies of magazine will be available in shops. Still looking for items of interest to be included.

LIBRARY/ GAMES HALL UPDATE: Mobile library starting 5th September on a weekly basis. Library closes on 31st August. Tenders for the work are to be in by 19th

August. The work will take approximately 8 - 12 weeks. EAC preparing managing documents for MEG group.

Problems with staffing at games hall. It will remain open Monday -Friday. Hours to be decided.

KAMES DISASTER: No further update- Service is pencilled in for last Sunday in November. The venue for service still to be decided.

INPUT FROM PUBLIC: Victory Park being used as a car park by contractors. Damage to grass and ongoing drainage problems. (JR)

Car park at Victory Park needs the 'wildlife' garden strimmed down as it is an eyes ore. (\mbox{CL})

Manhole cover at Garronhill junction with A70 has been reported but not repaired as yet.(CL)

Heritage layby has a wet area, not sure if it is a water leak or sewerage. (JR)

A.O.C.B. Sorn Road still no white lines.(CL). Penbreck not on stream until 2021.

Gallawhistle – no payments until February due to problems with EAC. Need to hold a public meeting to discuss how the monies are to be distributed and what criteria groups need.

Economic Development in library every week to help with employment issues. At present it is only advertised in jobcentres – need to print in Muirkirk News.

Fitness suite – charges still to be discussed . Is in MEG group remit. Still very early days yet as nothing has been decided.

Yipworld are contracted to supply youth club in Muirkirk, due to lack of interest they will be trying again in the near future.

An issue with disabled parking on Glasgow Road. Claire Leitch will look into problem.

Traffic lights at Glasgow Road are faulty.

Dog fouling a problem at cemetery. Bags with dog poo have been thrown into private property in Lovedale. Ask EAC for bin.

Heritage Park has been weeded and tidied by 3 elderly members of MEG.

Extract from Muirkirk Advertiser 1914

The big story of 1914 was, of course, the outbreak of world war 1 and the people of Muirkirk were not to be found wanting in their efforts to help the war effort. A local parish Relief Fund Committee was set up, and soon Muirkirk's contribution, both financially and materially, was considerable, with functions of all kinds being held regularly to augment the fund, as well a collections for blankets, crockery, etc, etc. In November, Wellwood House was made available as a convalescent home, and twelve wounded Belgian soldiers were the first residents. Nurse Cameron was in constant attendance, and the Medical Attendant was Dr Caruthers. In December six families of Belgium refugees were accommodated at the Southside. Hardly a week went past without the youth of the village providing a volunteer for the armed services. By the end of the year, 194 muirkirk men had enlisted plus 21 from Glenbuck.
