Chairman's Update

At the recent well attended Community Council Meeting we were given a presentation by the Scottish Mines Restoration Trust with regards to the progress being made on the restoration works on the various local opencast sites. The works are progressing well on Powharnal, Grasshill, Ponesk & Spireslack with completion expected in 2018. Although preliminary works have started at Glenbuck SMRT are awaiting the result of a funding application to the Lottery Heritage Fund to enable them to properly plan the scope of works. Dalfad restoration works are imminent and the time-frame for all works to be complete is around 4 years.

The Community Council can confirm that a number of volunteers have planted around 4000 daffodil & narcissi bulbs in various locations around the village and a big thank you to all concerned and we look forward to the spring when we ought to see the result of the hard work. We have also been gifted a further 2000 bulbs which we would expect to have been planted by the date of the next publication of the News.

We are pleased to report that the Murder Mystery Show held in St Thomas's Hall and promoted by the Gaiety Theatre was a great success and a good night was had by all.

There was a good turnout for the fireworks display which from the feedback was excellent and we were one of the few villages in the area that were able to put on such an event. We would take this opportunity to thank Muirkirk Community Association and East Ayrshire Car Club for organising the display.

The Community Council have had an approach from a small Spanish village Castelloli in Catalonia with regards to exploring a twinning or friendship agreement. We have agreed to go forward with this and we will further advise when we have more information.

We can confirm that Stagecoach representatives will be in attendance at the next Meeting on the 4th of December to discuss the local bus services.

We also have Mr Clive Walton of the RSPB coming along to give a Presentation about his work in the Muirkirk Uplands Site of Special Scientific Interest and the Muirkirk & North Lowther Uplands SPA, but also there is the RSPB's broader work at e.g. the mines restoration at Powharnal and our own nature reserve at Airds Moss. Mostly the project is about working with farmers. If any of the above are of interest to you please come along to the Meeting and express your views.

Meeting held on Monday 2nd October 2017 in Community rooms.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and proposed by Tom Bark and seconded by Judith Linton.

MATTERS ARISING: No update on BT, railings at school, flooding at Heritage layby, Trotters building(owner not responsive) and disabled parking on Glasgow Road.

The seat at Henderson Drive is to be replaced. The painting of white lines on the Sorn Road are in the system to be done. The manhole cover at junction of Garronhill and Main Street has been fixed. Victory Park – J Roberts has a meeting with roads dept tomorrow. Wildlife' garden at car park has been strimmed.

POLICE REPORT: No police present.

COUNCILLORS: The school opening day was a success, although no invites were sent to Community Council. The Multilotto has a pot of £10 k for community groups. The A70 Glenbuck re-alignment will start January 2018. There have been more complaints about the RBS mobile bank re disabled access. The River Ayr walk has had £10k spent on it by South Ayrshire council who are looking to spend a further £39k in future.

The completion of Day Centre will be mid December 2017.

EAC is awaiting budgets being set for next year.

MEG: Work on Day Centre has started. The knotweed spraying is having some effect although some patches have been missed.

EA Car Club: Has had a meeting with Sports Council- no grants available until March or April. Hoping to have refurbishment on house completed by April if money is available. Need to raise $\pounds 50k$ - $\pounds 60$ for track upgrade. Fireworks display is ok.

TREASURERS REPORT: Balance - £1991.15

CORRESPONDENCE: none

PLANNING: Extension of hard standing at Caravan Park.

MUIRKIRK NEWS: There are 250 copies printed every month with delivery of 194 copies and 10 postal copies. The timescale is a bit tight. It was agreed to put the link to Muirkirk News in the computer in library.

DAFFODILS: There will be bulb planting over three weekends. A total of 3000 are to be planted. There has been discussion with EAC as to where bulbs are to be planted. Start at Heritage Lay by. Planting at all entrances of village and at foot of signs and trees. Dates to be arranged. Check facebook page.

KAMES DISASTER: Arrangements are well on way. The order of service will be finalised on 2nd November. Buffet will cater for 120 with relatives and distant travellers being served first. Wilma Brady is in charge of catering. Teas and coffees in community rooms for others.

2pm at church for service 3pm wreath laying 3.15pm at school rooms for refreshments.

WINDFARMS : Two representatives from Renewable Fund attended. Information given was very useful to all groups. Applications must be in by 31st January2018 for the first meeting in May 2018.

INPUT FROM PUBLIC: Victory Park flooding still an issue. Water has been flooding down to school but this has been dealt with by EAC. It was suggested inviting an architect to a future meeting. The road at the top of the Victory Park is in a dangerous state.

Seat at cemetery needs painting (EAC).Walkway from Southside to Kames Farm needs draining.

Drainage problem still ongoing on Burmah Road even though drain has been deepened.

Suggestion made to contact Ayrshire Magazine to promote the village.

A local businessman asked for details of the correct person to contact at EAC to purchase and refurbish properties in village.

A.O.C.B. Due to vacant properties some rumours have started that tenants will be moved from Burns Avenue to Main Street sheltered housing. The meeting was assured that no decision has been made as there are a number of empty properties in Muirkirk and a solution has to be found to solve the problem. Local councillors will keep public informed.

Banana, Walnut and Choc Chip Bread and Butter Pudding

Ingredients

300ml Cream
300ml Milk
1 Vanilla Pod (remove seeds)
4 Egg yolks
75g Caster Sugar
4-6 Slices of bread, no crusts

Method

Preheat oven to 180°c.

- 1. Whisk together 4 egg yolks with caster sugar
- 2. Add to milk, whisking continuously
- 3. Sieve mixture and leave to rest. (Custard)
- 4. Layer bread, banana, walnuts and chocolate chips. Layer until dish is full.
- Pour over custard and put in a big tin for water bath for 30-35 mins. Water ³/₄ up tin.
- 6. Sprinkle over icing sugar and place under grill.

Mention must be made of the tireless efforts of Captain Montgomery, R.A.M.C., and all under his command in rescuing and evacuating wounded, often in circumstances of the greatest danger. All who saw him personally seeking for and attending to casualties on the battlefield were inspired by the realisation that if wounded they would be cared for no matter how hot the enemy fire might be, and we are proud that he should have been awarded the Military Cross for the services he rendered to his Regiment. In his work he was particularly assisted by Private Fletcher, his driver, who continually drove his jeep fearlessly into the front line and carried the wounded back to the aid post. It is calculated that Fletcher, who only 19 years old, was responsible for the rescue of some forty wounded men. It was a tragic blow that a few nights later he should have been killed by a shell while driving the quartermaster with rations to the rest area. He was one of the bravest and most cheerful men we knew, and his death cast a shadow over the whole regiment.

Private Roland Fletcher was the older brother of Mrs Cynthia Barrie of 24 Garronhill, Muirkirk
