Chairman's Update

Congratulations to the three Muirkirk Groups who were successful in East Ayrshire Council's recent Participatory Budgeting Event. A big thank you to the many residents who went down to Cumnock and voted and also to everyone from the village who assisted at the Event.

The winning bids were from Muirkirk CC & MEG £2000, Gala Day Committee & East Ayrshire Car Club £2000 and Muirkirk Parish Church & St Thomas the Apostle's Parish Muirkirk £1250.

A Memorandum of Understanding for the Community Benefit from Penbrek Wind Farm was signed by three local groups Muirkirk CC, MEG and Muirkirk Community Association. The wind farm is due to come on steam in 2021 and the benefit will come direct to the Community to be spent on local Projects.

In a similar vein East Ayrshire Council are looking at piloting a scheme in Muirkirk whereby the Community Benefit arising from Galawhistle wind farm will come direct to the Community again to be spent on local projects. The benefits are now accruing so this will happen fairly quickly.

On recent site visits to see the restoration to the opencast works at Powharnal, Ponesk & Spireslack we can confirm these are progressing well and the Contractor expects to be finished by the end of this year. The only leaves Dalfad in our area for which funding is being sought at this time.

As you will be aware the Games Hall has closed after forty years which is a loss to the village but on a more positive note the HUB in Furnace Road may well be open by the time you read this Newsletter. We believe this will be a great facility for the village and that it will be well supported by the Community to make it a success.

Muirkirk CC have taken over the organisation of the Lapraik Festival from the Community Association who ran it for ten years. They will be a hard act to follow as they did a tremendous job over that period. It is being headed by Harry Murray, supported by a Committee a number of whom are outwith the Community Council. The festival is being held on the 15th & 16th of June so take a note of the date for your diary.

You may have read in the national or local press that the Westminster Government has announced that they are supportive of the proposed Ayrshire Growth Deal. This will bring substantial investment to the three counties. In particular road and rail infrastructure Projects in the old Cumnock and Doon valley area ought to benefit so watch this space for further announcements.

We hope you are still enjoying reading our Newsletter. We are constantly looking to improve it and are looking for articles that would be of interest to our readers so if you have something that you think would meet the criteria we would be delighted to receive it.

Muirkirk Enterprise Group

Everybody associated with Enterprise Group would like to thank everyone who voted for our joint project with Muirkirk Community Council in the recent East Avrshire Council Participatory Budget programme.

Muirkirk Enterprise Group, Muirkirk Community Council and the Muirkirk Community Association recently signed a memorandum of understanding with a Wind Farm developer setting out how we can use the funds that will be available from the development at Penbreck to help improve the lives of everyone in Muirkirk. This development will not be on stream for a number of years, but when it does it will be the first on-shore wind farm that will become operational without any subsidies and as such represents a breakthrough in the provision of clean renewable energy, and although the role of the community of Muirkirk in this landmark development is relatively small it is vital.

Hub Update

EAC have now produced a property rental contract that is currently being reviewed by MEG's lawyers. Hopefully completion will not be long delayed and the village will shortly be able make use of the new facility. MEG proposes to set up a volunteer sub-group to handle the day to day running of the HUB, which will provide a library service, a fitness suite and a kitchen which will provide cookery lessons and the opportunity for inter and intra-generational socialisation across the Muirkirk Community.

Finally, as everyone is probably aware, 2018 marks the 100th anniversary of the effective end of WW1. The Great War as it was known at the time has had an enormous impact on the history of the world and MEG would like to help ensure that Muirkirk commemorates this event to that end we will be setting up a sub group to work with other community organisations to ensure that this happens.

Day one

"40 Blue bags were ordered and filled in a matter of no time. We didn't count the Black bags but there are many. These photos are of Miller's Road, Muirkirk. More litter was collected coming into the village from the Strathaven side also."

Day two

"Day 2 litter picking and these (video on Facebook) are only a fraction of the bags filled today. There are a few sitting aside and another 31 at the Strathaven side alone and we've only managed to dent it. It would take teams coming from each entrance of the village a fortnight or more to clean the place up. So far we've managed Miller's Road, the majority of Smallburn, the Heritage Park and along Hawkshaw Terrace, the two pads between Miller's Road and the Victory Park, parts of the Kirk Plantation and working our way in from the Strathaven side. We've had everything; nappies, condoms, Sanders, bikes, milk bottles, linoleum, you name it, it's been picked up. Respect to every single person out there over the last two days and the locals who pick up litter 365 days a year round here."

Lemon Drizzle Cake

Ingredients

225g unsalted butter 225g caster sugar 4 eggs 25g S.R flour Grated lemon zest Lemon juice

Method

- 1. Beat together sugar, butter and eggs
- 2. Slowly add flour and zest

The Scottish speed season gets under way on April 7th and 8th when East Ayrshire Car Club will be organising the opening two rounds of the 2018 Guyson Scottish Sprint Championship at Kames Motorsport Complex, Muirkirk.

Entries are expected to be down slightly on last April due to car preparation getting behind schedule because of the severe winter, but there is no doubting the quality of the entry the local club have attracted.

Heading the field is runner-up in the prestigious 2017 British Hillclimb Champion-ship Wallace Menzies who holds the track record for both the clockwise and anti-clockwise courses at Kames. The Stirling driver once clocked an incredible 129mph on this tight track and local enthusiasts will not want to miss the opportunity of seeing this spectacular driver as he will be spending the rest of 2018 racing at top venues between Jersey and Belfast. Wallace is highly popular with galleries all over the country with his aggressive style, but he faces talented opposition at this warm-up meeting from Midlander Dave Uren who was ninth in the British Championship and Wallace's wife, Nicola Menzies, both in big V8 singleseater racing cars similar to Wallace's Gould. A possible late entry could be former British Sprint Champion Stewart Robb in his big V8 Pilbeam, another regular at Kames.

Professor Tom Symington

Tom Symington was just one of many Muirkirk sons that graduated to professorship and made a name for himself in medical research. He excelled as a pathologist and was a popular academic researcher and teacher. He was born at the top of the town in 1915, and passed away in April 2007, here is one of the tributes to him.

Tom Symington was one of the giants of Morbid Anatomy in the 20th century. He carried out ground breaking research into the function of the adrenal gland that continues to affect the practice of medicine to this day. In the 50s and 60s he developed new techniques of morphological and chemical studies of the adrenal cortex to provide an understanding of its complicated structure, he also explained the roll of Hormone production played by cells in different zones of cortex. This research opened up an understanding of adrenal disease and paved the way for a treatment.

A great leader and communicator, he headed a department of pathology at Glasgow Royal Infirmary that was renowned internationally as a centre of excellence. It produced 11 future professors of pathology in the UK, CANADA and USA. Tom Symington was just one of the people who grew up in Muirkirk and contributed a great deal to the society of the world we know today.

Update on Ponesk & Powharnal Restoration Projects

As we emerge from a prolonged winter, Mines Restoration Limited would like to update the local community on progress and future plans for the sites at Ponesk and Powharnal.

PONESK

The focus of operations at Ponesk has moved eastwards into the Spireslack zone. Banks Mining has been concentrating on implementing slope stabilisation measures in the vicinity of Glenbuck (Area B) and reshaping the main overburden mound at the Galawhistle end of the site.

In Area B, an undercut face has been buttressed to prevent sudden collapse, with the buttress to be soiled and landscaped later this year as weather conditions improve.

The landform work on Ponesk is largely complete with only limited soiling and seeding operations remaining.

Related activities include treefelling operations on Grasshill Forest, construction of a new stream overflow channel for Area C void and recovery of sized stone for path and track construction.

GLENBUCK

We have always stated that any work to restore the village or football pitch at Glenbuck was always dependent upon us securing funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund.

We were therefore very disappointed to learn that our Heritage Lottery Fund application was met with a refusal on the basis of lack of community support (with no substantiation of that view being stated) and concerns over sustainability.

Notwithstanding the outcome of the application, we continue to review options for retaining and augmenting the village and mining heritage, with the current focus being on –

- (i) enabling safe access to the village site and its surroundings
- (ii) establishing improved light vehicle access, an informal picnic area and a parking facility
- working with East Ayrshire Council (EAC) to review prospects for heritage and geodiversity explanatory boards (similar to those planned by EAC for the Lethanhill project on the hillside near Patna)
- (iv) working with Forest Enterprise to examine the prospects for extending planned amenity and commercial woodland (across both Ponesk and Spireslack, as part of the restocking options for Grasshill).

Under the auspices of EAC we have attended compliance and technical meetings to ensure

contract delivery to the required standards, and we have also hosted community liaison group meetings where members of the community council and local residents have had the opportunity to examine progress and be kept appraised of future plans.

POWHARNAL

At Powharnal, the recent focus of MRL operations has been muck-shift and soils recovery on the northern face of the former workings, together with infilling voids in and around the eastern end of the site.

The Gasswater section has been reshaped, fully soiled and seeded, and a new agricultural track which permits access to a new viewpoint, has been added.

Going forward into our second full year of activity, we plan to complete soiling of the landform adjacent to the A70, and finish all soiling and planting work in and around the eastern extremity of the site.

The edges around the residual water body have been designed following a risk assessment aimed at classifying the treatment of slopes and margins to various standards consistent with safe countryside access requirements.

The next key step is to finalise the updated landscape plan and, following consultation with stakeholders (which include Muirkirk community council), submit the plan for approval by EAC. We expect to be able to circulate a draft plan next month.

Other works planned for this year include the reinstatement of various burn corridors at Welltrees and Gasswater, designed to eliminate flood potential. Tracks, paths and bridges are also planned for later this year to facilitate public access around the water body and linking it to the River Ayr walkway. In the fullness of time, a new parking area is to be established in the vicinity of the current site amenity yard.

In the wider area of MRL landholdings, the mitigation plan designed to bring the moorland back to full SPA status is now well established, with much work being carried out on drain blocking, rush management and fencing.

The Powharnal Management Committee, chaired by EAC, oversees that work and meets regularly to ensure delivery and compliance.

Terms have also been provisionally agreed with the RSPB to eventually allow it to take full ownership and control over Airds Moss east and associated land, thus meeting the provisions



as envisaged in the section 75 planning agreement for the site.

MRL remains committed to and has attended all liaison meetings, and has also hosted a series of site visits aimed at keeping the community informed. These have been well attended and are viewed as productive by MRL in terms of bringing forth ideas for land use.
