The recent road resurfacing programme has caused a lot of disruption to local commuters. However there is a big improvement in the condition of our local roads as a result of these works.

Paul Whittaker OBE visited Muirkirk recently. He is carrying out research on the maternal side of the family tree some of whom he believed lived here in the village. His mother's name was Whitfield and as it happens was a cousin of June Whitfield the actress. Thanks to the help from Jimmie Taylor, and the information he provided with regards to the burial records, Paul found two of his ancestors graves in the Parish Church cemetery. His family were involved in mining around Ayrshire in the eighteen hundreds with one of them working at Crossflatt pit. The family moved to the Huddersfield area which is where Paul was born. He is pretty famous in his own right having studied music at Oxford university despite being born profoundly deaf. He established and ran a musical charity for twenty seven years. He is also an international motivational speaker. He is looking to return in early October where I hope to meet up with him again.

In a similar vein, I received a letter from Stuart Murray, one of our postal readers. The letter contained an obituary he had cut out from the Herald newspaper. The obituary was about Dr Ian Preston CBE whose father Jack originally came from Muirkirk. Dr Preston was the first Chief Executive of Scottish Power and held a first class honours degree and doctorate in nuclear physics.

The above are another two examples among many others of people with connections to Muirkirk that have excelled in their careers. It must be something to do with the fresh air or water we get here.

Finally we wish all the bidders every success in their PB bids and would hope that not too many of the bids end in disappointment.

The youngsters have made great progress in recent months at closed-circuit rallies all over the UK and will soon be in a position to challenge their peers once their ages allow them to emerge from the one litre limitation on their "Junior" category.

The electric car is a Renault Zoe and it will be competing in the battle for outright honours and with so little known of the car's performance it will be interesting to see how it compares with the traditional petrol driven rally cars. The sound of such cars is another feature which will be of interest to motorists of all ages.

1918 THE GREAT WAR. Page 43

One Hundred years ago.

The war raged on in Europe and the sterling work of the Muirkirk Parish War Relief Fund Committee continued, with weekly collections, donations and a variety of fund-raising functions augmenting the funds, enabling the Committee to provide the soldiers with extra clothing, food parcels, etc. but all the while the sons of Muirkirk were paying a high price for the country's effort to obtain peace in Europe.

Up and till the end of 1917, fifty-six local lads had paid the supreme sacrifice.

The Advertiser had stopped printing for quite a few months due to material shortages, but was starting up again to keep folk up to speed with what was happening in the village. The new price of the paper was going up to one penny a copy.


